
Happy Friday! It seems like school has just started and we are already at the end of the third week. Our students are settled, have made friends and already having a great time on campus.



### **CLUB SPOTLIGHT**

In this exercise, the Forensic students learn about crime scenes and how to record a crime scene. They need to spot evidence and practice the proper way to record, photograph and measure each item. They also learned how to collect evidence and later how to process them.

Students then needed to recreate the crime scene in a sketch and present it to the class. Students must use their logical reasoning and analytical skills to assess the evidence and also how to secure the crime scene.





## **CLUBS AND ACTIVITIES**

#### THE FORENSICS CLUB (GRADES 11-12) - ADVISOR: DR. ANDERSON

Forensics is the application of any type of science (i.e., biological, psychological, social, physical, or mathematical) to legal matters. Some topics that will be covered include criminal profiling, the defendant's competency to stand trial, the insanity defense, jury selection/courtroom analysis, eyewitness and expert testimony, lie detection, and scientific procedures used to solve crimes. Using scientific methods, students will collect and analyze evidence through simulated crime scenes such as fingerprint analysis, ballistics, blood splatter analysis, and DNA analysis.

#### THE PSYCHOLOGY CLUB (GRADES 7-12) - ADVISOR: DR. ANDERSON

The Psychology Club is a student organization whose mission shall be to encourage, promote, and build a greater understanding of the field of psychology throughout the student body, high school, and community. The overall goal is to enhance the experience and appreciation of psychology to all students through a variety of social and educational activities. The psychology club is a great way for students to pursue their interests, gain insight from peers with similar interests, and establish themselves as a leader.

#### THE PRE-MED CLUB - ADVISOR: DR. HOJREH

Through this club, high school students will be able to gain a better understanding of the pre-medical and medical track by attending presentations given by students and doctors, initiating school-wide efforts to give back to the community.


