





Dear Iron Eagle Family, Happy Friday!


We hope that you are doing well and getting ready for your three-day weekend. We do not have school on Monday, September 4th in observance of Labor Day.

CLASSROOM SPOTLIGHT

In this lab, students will be studying osmosis using potatoes. Osmosis is the diffusion (passive molecules through movement) of water selectively permeable membrane (a membrane that allows for diffusion of selected solutes and water) from a region of higher water potential (high concentration) to a region of lower water potential (low concentration) until equilibrium is reached. Today the students are measuring the weight differences from their sample of potatoes in different concentrations of sugar that they set up yesterday. They will then calculate the natural amount of sugar that exists in potatoes, sweet potatoes, and apples.
