
Hello Iron Eagle Families, Happy Friday!

Happy Thanksgiving, have a great time with your family and enjoy your holidays. I will see you after the break.




#### **NJHS FIELD TRIP**

NJHS members volunteered at the GARDEN OF TOMORROW in Phoenix. Part of a non-profit organization-Tiger Mountain Foundation. Students learned how to harvest and garden. In volunteering their time students were able to build practical life skills while helping their local community.









#### **PEPSICO FIELD TRIP**

Today Dr. Hojreh and his class went on a field trip to Pepsico. First, they got an introduction to the plant by the plant manager. They have all green facilities that use two types of solar energy, regular electric and solar water units, which heat up the water before the ingredients are added.

They process so much Pepsi products that they use 1.5 million gallons of water each day. They gave us a tour of their plant. There were many different lines of production, one for each size. They showed us their hot and pasteurized line, here they bottle the Gatorade at 180 degrees. They cap it and immediately flip the bottle and chill it so it seals it airtight. Then there was a line that they used a cold fill method. This saves a lot of plastic, but it is tougher to keep the sterility.
