
It's hard to believe that we are getting closer to Quarte 1 already. We are proud of our students for being involved in academics, sports, and extracurricular activities.

## SPIRIT WEEK 9/18 – 9/21

Our First Spirit Week is hosted by the MIT Student Council which will take place next week from Monday to Thursday. Following are the spirit days and it will cost \$1.00 per student to participate for each day. This is a fundraising event and all the money raised will go towards the preparation of the upcoming Pep Rally event in the following week.

Students can also use their Green Reward Slips in place of \$1.00. If students have earned five green slips, they can use them for one day of participation and they do not have to pay the dollar.

Parents and Students, we are having a celebration but at the same time, we want to make sure that we are maintaining a safe and respectful school environment. Therefore please read the uniform expectations and the dress code policy below from our student handbook. If a student is not following the dress code policy for the spirit days, they will need to stay in the front office until someone brings another set of clothes for them to change. ### **Here are our MIT Uniform Rules for the Dress Down/ Spirit Days.**

**Non-Uniform (Dollar Dress) Days** Non-uniform days are a privilege for MIT students. On non-uniform days, students must remember that they must still follow a dress code. As always, modesty is mandatory. The administration and faculty reserve the right to judge what is appropriate and safe. If non-uniform dress is considered inappropriate, infractions will result in loss of the non-uniform privilege for a specified period of time and a parent/guardian will be called to bring in a uniform. The student will not be allowed in class until in compliance with the code.

### **The following are non-uniform day regulations:**

Jeans, slacks, shorts, Capri pants, and dresses must be clean and with no holes. Pants may not be oversized or baggy. All shorts and dresses must conform to a uniform length. Students are not to wear biker shorts, cut-offs/frayed edge clothing, clothing with inappropriate slogans, etc., tank tops, midriff shirts, spaghetti strap tops, tube tops, clothing which exposes undergarments, hip-hugging pants, and sandals—strapless or otherwise. Athletic shoes may always be worn.





We look forward to seeing the great accomplishments made by our new NJHS cabinet!






## CLASSROOM SPOTLIGHT

In this lab, the students are learning about Enzymes and the conditions that will prevent the enzyme from functioning. We are changing the conditions that the enzyme operates in and see if changes their reactivity. The liver was tested in acid, base, and salt solutions as well as cold and heated conditions.

Each enzyme is specific for a particular reaction because its amino acid sequence is unique which causes it to have a unique 3-dimensional structure. The active site is the portion of the enzyme that interacts with the substrate, peroxide here so any substance or conditions that block or change the shape of the active site affects the activity of the enzyme.

The interest form will close on Saturday, September 30th. If an MIT student does NOT complete the sport-specific interest form prior to that date, they will NOT be allowed to try out.


