Thank you again for your continued support and have a relaxing weekend.

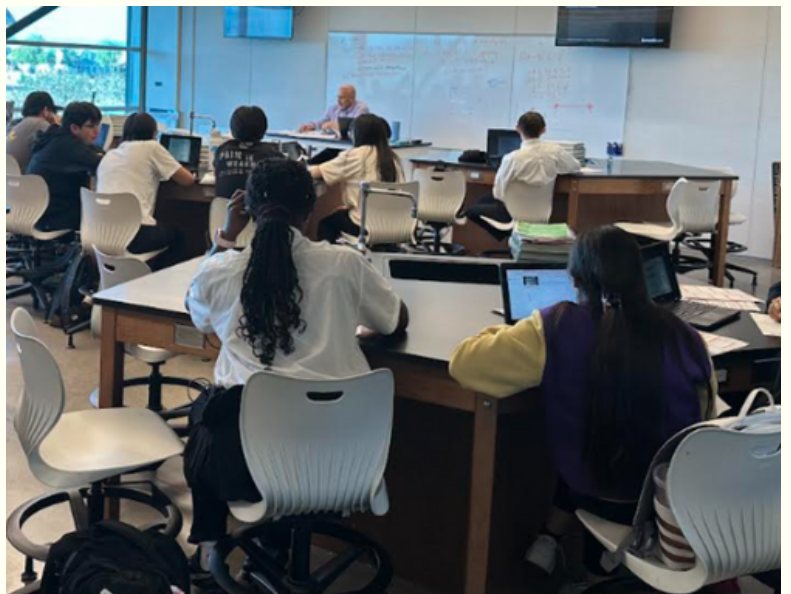

CLASS SPOTLIGHT – FORENSICS

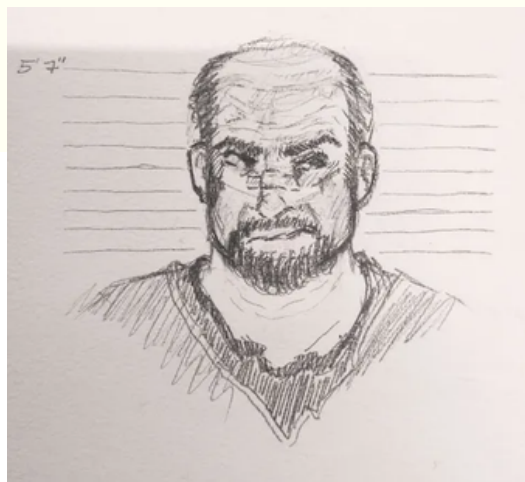
Last week, students in the forensics classes participated in a forensic psychology exercise: role-playing and the insanity defense. The use of role-playing in the form of a mock trial led to improved critical reasoning as well as heightened student involvement. Role-playing has been successful in the teaching of person perception, leadership, attribution, small group interaction, decision-making theories, and numerous other psychological themes (Alexander & Scriven, 1977). Thank you to Dr. Anderson for supervising the mock-trial activity and Mr. Morganstern for role-playing the judge. The students provided positive feedback regarding this exciting opportunity. 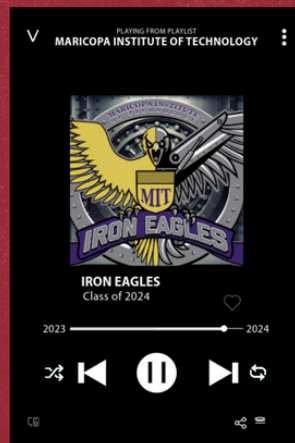
